It is More Important Than Ever to Get the Flu Vaccine: Flu shot options are plentiful though Agency locations are limited

According to the <u>Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)</u> and <u>Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH)</u>, getting a flu vaccine during 2020-2021 is more critical than ever, although, getting a flu vaccine at a State agency will be limited. However, **State Employees, Retirees and dependents have MANY options to obtain the flu vaccination at no cost to you. Choose the option and location that is most convenient for your family. Please remember, if you access care through your doctor or pharmacy, plan requirements and network utilization apply.***

- All CMS-sponsored health plans cover 100% of the cost of the influenza vaccine for in-network providers. Contact your medical provider to find out how to obtain a flu vaccine in your medical home.
- Many providers are offering walk-in, scheduled, or drive-thru clinics for their patients. For
 example, in Springfield and surrounding areas, Springfield Clinic is providing a variety of flu shot
 options for existing patients:

- Contact your local health department to determine their plan for flu shots this year. Many have walk-thru or drive-thru clinics.*
 - Sangamon County Department of Public Health offers a drive-thru clinic from 9 AM 3
 PM Tuesdays through Fridays at their South Grand location, with a lane for "State Employees Only" and additional locations throughout the community;
 - Jackson County Health Department offers public drive-thru clinics October 1, and October 22. Additionally, clinics specifically for State employees and families at SIUC are offered
 - from 8 AM 3 PM on October 6, 7, 14 and 15;
 - Kane County Health is offering flu shots for State employees (sign-up at the links below)
 - Friday, October 2, in Elgin
 - Friday, October 9, in Aurora;

- Many pharmacies offer scheduled or walk-in flu shots this year check to make sure the pharmacy you select is in your health and/or pharmacy plan's network.*
